- e. Why according to Shylock, his claim could not be denied? Mention two aspects of Shylock's character revealed here. [4]

- d. What assurance does Antonio offer to Portia later in the scene? Why does he assure her? [3]
- e. What does Portia give to Antonio after his assurance? What role does the ring play at the end of the play? [4]

- e.What is the speaker's state of mind at the end of the poem? What does the poem reveal about the attitude of public? [4]
